| 3.1 Information | <p>Ng Teng Fong General Hospital (NTFGH) is a 700-bed tertiary care centre under the National University Health System (NUHS).</p> <p>The Department of General Surgery provides comprehensive surgical services, including breast surgery, thyroid and endocrine surgery, bariatric and metabolic surgery for obesity, colorectal surgery, upper gastro-intestinal surgery, hepatobiliary surgery, surgical oncology and surgical endoscopy for diagnostic and therapeutic interventions, as well as vascular and endovascular surgery.</p> <p>The fellow will attend ward rounds, outpatient specialist colorectal clinics, endoscopy and take part in both elective and emergency operating sessions with all the faculty members. There will be night duty per rostered.</p> <p>Clinical exposure will comprise all aspects of colorectal surgery and general surgery which includes, but is not limited to,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Major Laparoscopic colorectal cancer surgery including extra-levator Abdominoperineal excision, TaTME, Transanal surgery - Formation of stoma, reversal of stoma - Simple and complex fistula in ano surgery - Haemorrhoidectomy including laser haemorrhoidopexy - Colonoscopy and advance endoscopy-Endoscopic submucosal dissection for advanced polyp - Emergency colorectal surgery for obstruction, perforation, and bleeding - Specialist outpatient colorectal clinics - Colorectal/general surgery on call <p>NTFGH Colorectal Surgery Fellowship Programme is an accredited fellowship training centre with the Singapore Medical Council (SMC).</p> |

| <p>3.2 Objectives</p> | <p>Sub-specialist training in Colorectal Surgery</p> <p>To gain an understanding and basic management of both benign colorectal diseases as well as colorectal cancer</p> <p>To develop colorectal surgical skills for anorectal disease as well as laparoscopic colorectal surgery.</p> <p>To learn or improved basic and/or advanced colonoscopy skill.</p> |
| <p>3.3 Duration</p> | <p>12 Months Fellowship Programme</p> |
| <p>3.4 Training Information</p> | <p>The fellowship will be with the Division of Colorectal Surgery under the supervision of a SMC Supervisor from the Department of General Surgery at Ng Teng Fong General Hospital (NTFGH), Singapore.</p> <p>The fellow will attend ward rounds, outpatient clinics and both elective and emergency operating sessions with all the faculty members.</p> <p>Clinical exposure will comprise all aspects of colorectal surgery and general surgery which includes, but is not limited to,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Major Laparoscopic colorectal cancer surgery including extra-levator Abdominoperineal excision, TaTME, Transanal surgery - Formation of stoma, reversal of stoma - Simple and complex fistula in ano surgery - Haemorrhoidectomy including laser haemorrhoidopexy - Colonoscopy and advance endoscopy-Endoscopic submucosal dissection for advanced polyp - Emergency colorectal surgery for obstruction, perforation, and bleeding - Specialist outpatient colorectal clinics - Colorectal/general surgery on call <p>The fellow will attend regular Multidisciplinary Colorectal tumour board meeting on a weekly basis and present preoperative and post operative cancer patients that are managed in the Division. The fellow will also be expected to attend Colorectal Surgery clinics with the Consultants and will have the opportunity to see new cases and formulate a management plan for them. Involvement in the Colorectal cancer follow-up clinic and working alongside medical oncologist is also expected.</p> <p>Fellows will be educated in an evidence-based approach to operative and non-operative treatments.</p> |

| | <p>The fellow will also take part in the colorectal/general surgery on call rota to enable exposure to emergency colorectal and acute care general surgery.</p> <p>It is anticipated that the fellow will be involved in major colorectal resections, endoscopy (Gastroscopy and colonoscopy) procedures in the 12 months fellowship. He/she will have the opportunity to be the first surgeon and will be under working under close supervision of a senior surgeon.</p> <p>Fellows will be educated in an evidence-based approach to operative and non-operative treatments. The fellow will also take part in the colorectal/general surgery on call rota to enable exposure to emergency colorectal and acute care general surgery.</p> <p>The fellow will have opportunity to join the Tumour Board Meetings and learn how decisions are made for patients presented in the meetings.</p> <p><u>Research and teaching</u></p> <p>Involvement with ongoing research projects and audits in the breast surgery division.</p> <p>The fellow will be expected to be active in teaching both postgraduate trainees and medical students.</p> |
| <p>3.5 Assessment Method</p> | <p>Fellows will be assessed by a senior member of the colorectal faculty using the same tools that are employed by the ACGME residency program; mini CEX, case discussions/presentations, directly observed procedural skills (DOPS) and 360-degree appraisals. Fellows will be required to keep a log of all the surgical procedures in which they have been involved including any complications that may have occurred. Their research output and teaching logs will also be evaluated as part of the assessment.</p> |
| <p>4. Target Audience</p> | <p>The fellow should have some prior exposure to colorectal surgery. Ideally, they should be in the final year of training in their own country or at a post graduate level after completing the surgical training programme in their own country. This fellowship will provide the fellow the opportunity to obtain basic skills in colorectal surgery and equip them to be able to operate some procedures independently within limits after the 12-month fellowship.</p> |
