5	Training Method	Methods of training include participation in:
		1. Outpatient clinics.
		2. Ward rounds.
		3. Operating Theatre.
		4. Department meetings.
		5. Teaching sessions, including case discussions and presentations.
		6. Shoulder & Elbow arthroscopy and/or arthroplasty courses, where possible.
		Rotation (s) to other institution (s)/ departments
		Our clinical fellow will train mainly in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, Ng Teng Fong
		General Hospital (NTFGH) for 9 months out of 12-month fellowship. For the remaining 3 months,
		they will be rotated to the Shoulder & Elbow Service, Department of Orthopaedic Surgery,
		National University Hospital (NUH). In essence, they will be only be trained within the NUHS
		cluster while closely supervised by SMC-approved supervisors in Shoulder & Elbow Surgery
		employed either by NTFGH or NUHS.
		Supervision Method Each clinical follow will have an assigned primary supervisor for the entire period of the
		Each clinical fellow will have an assigned primary supervisor for the entire period of the
		fellowship, who will be at least Consultant grade employed either by NTFGH or NUHS. The
		Programme Director/ Head of Division will be responsible for their training, supervision and
		welfare during the programme. In addition, the Programme Director/ Head of Division receives guidance from and reports to Adj A/Prof Fareed Kagda, Head of Department of Orthopaedic
		Surgery, NTFGH and the Group Chief, Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, NUHS.

	Evaluation	The appointed primary supervisor for the clinical fellow in Department of Orthopaedic Surgery,
		NTFGH will remain as the primary supervisor for the entire period of the fellowship. When the
		clinical fellow is rotated to Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, NUH, the primary supervisor will
		solicit feedback from the secondary/on-site supervisor to complete a joint assessment report at
		SMC's stipulated intervals.
		The clinical fellow will be assessed by primary supervisor, based on the following:
		1. Case discussions
		2. Operative skills assessment
		3. Procedural logbook
		4. Outpatient clinic and Inpatient ward performance
		Feedback
		1. Scheduled reviews with Programme Director and supervisor at 3rd, 6th, 9th month of
		fellowship.
		2. Ad-hoc meetings with supervisor as and when the need arises.
